



Taiwanese semiconductor companies TSMC and Mediatek were the strongest contributors to fund performance. Tencent, the Chinese internet company, also contributed positively after a recovery from the proposed video gaming regulations in December and also presented a strong report during the quarter. Indian Indus Towers also contributed to fund returns.

The most negative impact on performance was Indian HDFC Bank, which previously had strong growth and profitability but is currently experiencing setbacks in yield rates and loan growth after the ongoing integration with HDFC. The Chinese insurance company AIA and the Brazilian stock exchange operator B3 were also negative contributors. New holdings added to the fund included Samsung Electronics and HDFC Life.
